

# GUIDE TO ITALIAN ARTICLES

Articles must agree in number and gender with the noun they are paired with. They also may change depending on the first letter of the noun. All the rules can seem a bit tricky at first, but you will get the hang of them with practice!

## FEMININE DEFINITE (THE) ARTICLES

### SINGULAR

**la** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with all consonants

**l'** : for all singular feminine nouns that start with vowels

### PLURAL

**le** : for all plural feminine nouns, no matter what they start with

## FEMININE INDEFINITE (A/AN) ARTICLES

### SINGULAR

**una** : for all singular feminine nouns that start with consonants

**un'** : for all singular feminine nouns that start with vowels

### PLURAL

No plurals for indefinite (like there is no plural article for English "a/an")

## MASCULINE DEFINITE (THE) ARTICLES

### SINGULAR

**il** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with "normal" consonants

**lo** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with 'weird' consonants: z, ps, gn, s+consonant

**l'** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with vowels

### PLURAL

**i** : for all plural masculine nouns that start with "normal" consonants

**gli** : for all plural masculine nouns that start with 'weird' consonants (z, ps, gn, s+consonant) & all plural masculine nouns that start with vowels [think of gli as the plural for lo and l']

## MASCULINE INDEFINITE (A/AN) ARTICLES

### SINGULAR

**un** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with "normal" consonants and vowels

**uno** : for all singular masculine nouns that start with 'weird' consonants: z, ps, gn, s+consonant

### PLURAL

No plurals for indefinite (like there is no plural article for English "a/an")
